


### **SEP Demographics**

100% of SEP participants were Caucasian.


#### **SEP Participant Age Range**

# **Drug Use Information**

The top three most reported drugs of choice are heroin, cocaine and meth.

Over 70% of SEP participants report heroin or other opioid as their drug of choice.

# Housing

99% of SEP participants in March reports living in the 41031 zip code.

40% reported being homeless, 40% reported renting their home and 40.% reported owning their home.

#### **Employment**

5% of participants who visited SEP in March reported being a veteran and 35% reported some form of employment.

# **HIV and Hepatitis C**

SEP offers HIV and hepatitis C (HCV) screenings to the community has part of outreach. Since September 2016 SEP has done over 100 screenings within the WEDCO district communities.
